Parent Engagement at Home

Grades K-2

- Phonics Scavenger Hunt: Create a list of objects around the house that start with a particular phonics sound (e.g., the "b" sound). Have your child find and name each object.
- Phonics Storytime: Choose a phonics sound for the day and challenge family members to find words or objects around the house that contain that sound. Then, create a story using those words.

Grades 3-6

- Book Reviews: After reading a book, have your child write or draw a simple review of it. This encourages critical thinking and reflection.
- Comic Books and Graphic Novels: Embrace a variety of reading materials, including comic books and graphic novels, which can be particularly appealing to young readers.

Grades 7-12

- Family Book Club: Choose a book to read together as a family and set aside time for regular discussions to share your thoughts and insights.
- Movie or Documentary Nights: Select educational documentaries or thought-provoking films to watch together, followed by discussions about the themes and topics presented.

All Grade Levels

• Cooking with Reading: Involve your child in cooking or baking activities that require reading and following recipes. It's a fun way to improve their reading and math skills simultaneously.

End of Course (EOC) exams are standardized tests that high school students take at the conclusion of specific courses. These exams are tailored to the subject matter covered in that particular class. They serve several important purposes:

Assessment of Learning: EOC exams are designed to assess what students have learned in a specific course. They measure their comprehension of the content, skills, and knowledge taught throughout the school year.

Graduation Requirements: EOC exams are a graduation requirement. Students may need to pass certain EOC exams to earn their high school diploma.
